Her work seeks to explore what Mestizaje means for her and for her people in relation to their divided cultural identity. She would like to think about her work as a way of reclaiming her non-western heritage by going back to her Andean roots which were not present in her westernized education as an artist in Peru. She earned a BFA in Painting at Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú in Lima and is currently working towards completing her MFA in Fiber and Material Studies at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.
